Another anti COP21 march, organised yesterday Versailles (50 km from Paris) had leads of police arrests and summonses of the house arrest for 24 manifestants ecologists. President Francois Hollande was alerted by the Greens leaders, including Cecile Duflot. Emmanuelle Cosse talked to Bernard Cazeneuve. And Saturday, questioned by Greenpeace during a meeting at the Elysee, the president reassured: "I just give instructions so that there is no house arrests of activists linked to COP. "Overzealous prefects will be called to order, and pro-environment protests in the provinces will be maintained, according to our information. The state of emergency does not want the enemy of the COP21, President Hollande can not be the enemy of climate activists." Official sources, with agencies.
